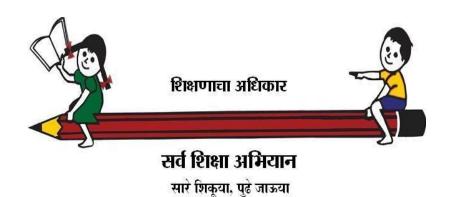

As per Para 104 of Manual on Financial Management & Procurement, it is necessary to appoint auditor every year so as to adhere to the Schedule of Audit arrangements prescribed in the Manual as per Para 106.9. As per Para 106.9 of CHAPTER –VIII AUDITING, -106 Audit by the Chartered Account Firm-of Manual on Financial Management & Procurement, the CA firm for conducting the audit of SSA, NPEGEL and KGBV shall be selected from the C&AG/State AG's empanelled list.

Ministry of Human Resources Development (MHRD) vide its letter dated 15/02/2012 forwarded the empanel list of Chartered Accountants firms (Ten firms) to Maharshtra Prathmik Shikshan Parishad for appointment of Statutory Auditor. The Terms of Reference (TOR) as prescribed in Annex. XVII of the Mannual was sent to the listed 10 C.A.Firms and were asked to submit their Technical and Financial proposals. 7 C.A.Firms submitted their Technical proposal, on scrutiny of the Technical proposal, their Financial proposal were opened.

On opening of Financial proposals of 7 C.A.Firms, M/s **S.K.Patodia & Associates, Mumbai,** Shree Shakambhari Corporate Park, Plot No. 156-58, Chakravarti Ashok Complex, (Near Cambridge School), J.B.Nagar, Andheri (E.), Mumbai- 400 099 have submitted their lowest yearly fees i.e. Rs.9,25,125/- + S.T. Extra for the Statutory Audit of SSA, NPEGEL, and KGBV for the Financial Year 2011-12.

The Executive Committee is, therefore, requested to accord approval for empanelment and also financial sanction for appointment of M/s M/s **S.K.Patodia & Associates, Mumbai** Shree Shakambhari Corporate Park, Plot No. 156-58, Chakravarti Ashok Complex, (Near Cambridge School), J.B.Nagar, Andheri (E.), Mumbai- 400 099, CA Firm as Statutory Auditor for the financial year 2011-12 at the total Yearly fees of Rs. 9,25,125/- + S.T. Extra.

Item No.662 : Submission of RTE Act 2009 and State RTE Rules along with

status of action taken by the State for the implementation

of the RTE Act 2009.

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#### RTE Act, 2009: -

Vide resolution Govt. of Maharahstra, School Education & Sports Department dated 10 May, 2010. RTE Act 2009, has come in force w.e.f 1 April 2010 in the entire State of Maharashtra.

#### State Rules, 2011:-

Vide notification of School Education & Sports Department, Mantralaya, Mumbai – 32 dated 11 October, 2011, Government of Maharashtra has made rules namely, Maharashtra Right of children to Free & compulsory Education Rules, 2011.

#### Protection of child's Educational Rights:-

State commission for protection of child rights (SCPCR) is functioning in the state.

#### Other Provisions:

For the implementation of the RTE Act, 2009, following provisions have received Cabinet approval and dully notified. The details are as follows:

#### • No detention & No Board Examination

Circular School Education & Sport Department No. VKAK-2009/case No. 292/Prashi -1, dt. 10 May, 2010. No child admitted in a school shall be held back in any class or expelled from school till the completion of elementary education. According to the provision vide section 30 of the Act no child shall be required to pass any Board examination till completion of elementary education.

Admission in class according to appropriate age, age proof for school admission
 Capitation Fee and Screening procedure: Circular School Education & Sport
 Department No. VKAK-2009/case No. 292 / Prashi -1, dt. 10 May, 2010.

**Age of child for school admission:** A child completing 6 years age will not be deprived from elementary education as per RTE Act-2009. However, in the light of existing provisions a child completing 5 years age will be eligible for admission in classroom and such child will be eligible for free and compulsory education.

**Age Proof for school admission:** No child should be denied admission in a school for lack of age proof.

Admission in class according to appropriate age: Vide section 4 of the Act, where a child above six years of age has not been admitted in any school or through admitted, could not complete his or her elementary education, then, he or she shall be admitted in a class appropriate to his or her age. Where a child is directly admitted in a class appropriate to his or her age, then he or she shall, in order to be par with others, have a right to receive special training and it will be responsibility of the concerned school and teachers.

**Right to change school:** Vide section 5 of the Act, a child shall have right to seek transfer to any other school within the State or outside the State for any reason. For seeking admission in such other school, the Head-teacher or in-charge of the school where such child was last admitted, shall immediately issue the transfer certificate.

**Admission Period:** Vide section 15 of the Act, a child shall be admitted in a school at the commencement of the academic year. Govt. specifies the extended period upto 30<sup>th</sup> September.

**Ban on Capitation Fee and Screening procedure for admission:** Vide section 13 of the Act, no school or person shall, while admitting a child, collect any capitation fee and subject the child or his or her parents or guardians to any screening procedure.

**Admission of CWSN:** Vide section 3 (2) of the Act and Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection and Full Participation) Act, 1996, every disabled child shall have right to pursue free and compulsory education upto the age of 18 years.

<u>Duty of Parents & Guardian</u>: Vide section 10 of the Act, it shall be duty of every parent of guardian to admit his or her child or ward, as

the case may be, to an elementary education in the neighbourhood school. For this purpose the parents shall be oriented.

# • Acquiring minimum qualification for teachers Circular School Education & Sport Department No. PRE-2010/case No. 213/ Prashi -1, dt. 14th June, 2010

Individually approved untrained teachers in the schools of Class I to VIII shall be compulsorily trained within duration of 5 years. Educational qualification of primary teachers in the state must be D.Ed. and for Class-VIII educational qualifications must

be Graduate + B.Ed. 25% posts of the teachers for the Classes V to VIII are for Graduate + B.Ed. Teachers under this 25% posts, if non B.Ed must complete B.Ed. with their own expenses till 31st March, 2015.

No Detention: Resolution School Education & Sport Department No. PRE-2010
 / (case-291)/ Prashi -1, dt. 16th June, 2010.

The pupils of Classes I to VIII declared failed in the year 2009-10 should be admitted the next class in the year 2010-11.

 SMC & SDP: Resolution School Education & Sport Department No. PRE-2010/(case-217) / Prashi -1, dt. 17th June, 2010

Vide section 21of the RTE Act-2009, a School Education Committee should compulsorily formed in every school before 30<sup>th</sup> September, 2010. The structure, functioning of SMC is laid down in the G.R. Vide section 22 of the Act, SMC shall prepare a School Development Plan.

Maintaining the PTR: Circular No. PRE-2010/case No. 225/Prashi -1
 Mantralaya, Vistar Bhavan, Mumbai 32, dt. 18 June 2010

Vide section 25 (1) of the RTE Act-2009, within six months from the date of commencement of this Act, the Pupil Teacher Ratio, as specified in the Scheduled, must be maintained in each school.

#### • CCE

Resolution School Education & Sport Department No. PRE-2010/(136/10)/Prashi -5, dt. 20th August, 2010

Vide section 30 (1) of RTE Act-2009, no child shall be required to pass any Board examination till completion of elementary education. Vide section 29 (1) & 29 (2) of the Act, strategy of continuous & comprehensive evaluation (CCE) will be adopted for Classes I to VIII from the academic year 2010-11. The strategy of CCE will be based on Formative Evaluation and Summative Evaluation.

**Use of Grade System**: The grade will be determined on the basis of the marks obtained in the subjects by the pupil and subject wise grade will be written in the progress card of the pupil.

# Physical punishment & mental harassment Resolution School Education & Sport Department No. PRE / 2010 / C.R.589 / Prashi-1, dt. 25th January, 2011.

Vide section 17 (1) of RTE Act-2009, no child shall be subjected to physical punishment or mental harassment and vide section 17 (2) whoever contravenes the provisions of sub-section (1) shall be liable to disciplinary action.

• Minimum number of working days / instructional hours in an academic year and minimum number of working hours per week for teacher Resolution School Education & Sport Department No. PRE / 2010 / C.R. 114/ Prashi-1, dt. 1st March, 2011.

Vide the schedule as per section 19 (1) chapter-4 of RTE Act-2009, minimum number of working days / instructional hours in an academic year as well minimum number of working hours per week for the teachers would be as follows-

- a) For 1st ot 5th class 200 working days and 800 instructional hours per academic year
- b) For 6th to 8th Class 220 working days and 1000 instructional hours per academic year
- c) 45 teaching including preparation hours per week for every teacher.
- Items under physical punishment and mental harassment

Vide section 17 (1) of RTE Act-2009, no child shall be subjected to physical punishment or mental harassment and vide section 17 (2) whoever contravenes the provisions of sub-section (1) shall be liable to disciplinary action.

Vide section 29 (1) of RTE Act-2009, Director, Maharashtra State Council of Educational Research & Training, Pune has been notified as Academic Authority.

#### Transport facility

# Resolution School Education & Sport Department No. PRE / 2011 / C.R.114 / Prashi-1, dt. 1st March, 2011.

Vide section 8 (b) Chapter 3 of RTE Act-2009, availability of neighbourhood primary school has to be ensured. Where such school cannot be made available, necessary transport facility will be made available for such children.

State has not yet notified the integrated elementary cycle. Separate Notification on 25% admission in private schools is in process.

## Item No.663 : To accord sanction for Constitution RTE Cell with the support of UNICEF.

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Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan is a vehicle of implementation of RTE Act-2009. The Annual Work Plan & Budget 2012-13 has major focus on RTE Act-2009 implementation. State is going through critical time especially the transition of Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan for implementation of RTE Act-2009 in Maharashtra. The state not only has the challenge of implementing a huge plan size but also academic support, co-ordination & monitoring from state level. For the effective implementation of RTE Act-2009, a RTE Cell is being created at Maharashtra Prathamik Shikshan Parishad, Mumbai to support Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan in the implementation of RTE in the state. RTE cell as envisioned with 5 consultant. Members of the cell will support the implementation of activities in the following areas -

- 1) **Access**: Identification of Out of school children, admission to age appropriate class, child tracking, organization of special training, Physical education, Building as Learning Aid, Infrastructure.
- 2) **Equity:** To eliminate disparity within various deprived groups of the society namely, SC / ST, Minority (Muslim), Gender and CWSN.
- Quality: Implementation of participatory quality classroom processes for constructivist learning, implementation of CCE, need based teacher training (modular training), activity based learning.
- 4) **Community Participation :** Media, Community Mobilization through Shiksha Ka Haq Abhiyan, Strengthening SMCs.

5) **Data management / Monitoring & Evaluation :** Computerization of various monitoring data, convergence of data (DISE, SEMIS, SDP, VER), web based interactive links for teachers and students learning.

UNICEF has agreed to financial & technical support to the RTE cell comprising 5 consultants leading different above mention thematic areas and part time existing administrative assistant for handling administrative and financial record of the RTE cell for a period of one year from the date of constitution of cell.

The approximate budget for RTE cell per month is estimated as per the details mentioned below –

The above mentioned posts of consultants in the RTE cell will be filled up on contractual / deputation basis for 6 months by issuing fresh proper advertisement through Maharashtra Prathamik Shikshan Parishad in consultation with UNICEF with clear Terms of References. All these 5 consultants will be based in Maharashtra Prathamik Shikshan Pariahad, Mumbai.

The Executive Committee is, therefore, requested to accord approval for constitution of RTE cell and recruitment of posts in RTE cell on contractual / deputation basis with financial and technical support from UNICEF.

# Item No.664 : To accord sanction for Implementation of Vipashyana training (MITRA) to teachers, the procedure and allotment of fund thereof.

#### A) Re-appropriation of funds of teacher training for Vipashyana training:-

Vide Government circular Dated 27<sup>th</sup> January, 2012 from every district minimum two teachers per school from 100 schools will be trained by Vipashayana training. Expenditure for training of 6600 teachers (33 districts x 100 schools x 2 teachers) @ Rs.200/- per day per teacher for 12 days is Rs.144.00 Lakhs.

It is proposed to utilize the funds sanctioned for the year 2012-13 under district level Management Head for Vipashayana training through re-appropriation as follows:-

# B) Inclusion of Vipashayana training curriculum in In-service teacher training of primary & secondary teachers from Director, MSCERT, Pune:

Vide Government circular Dated 27<sup>th</sup> January, 2012 it is proposed to include Curriculum of Vipashayana training in pre-service and in-service teacher training of primary & secondary. The Director MSCERT, Pune will be responsible for this activity.

#### C) Conduction of 10 days Vipashayana training in 15 days camp of First Year.

**D.T. Ed.**:- Vide Government circular Dated 27<sup>th</sup> January, 2012, 10 days training of Vipashayana be conducted in 15 days camp of First Year D.T. Ed. The guidelines to all DIETs and D.T. Ed Colleges will be issued by Director MSCERT, Pune.

- D) To Designate officers for Supervision. Monitoring & Co-ordination of MITRA programme at State, District and Taluka Level. :- To Supervise. Monitor & Co-ordinate MITRA programme in the State, it is proposed -
  - 1) To create one post of Jt. Director, MITRA Project from the cadre of Jt. Director Education in MPSP for the purpose of state level supervision, monitoring & co-ordination of MIRA Project. After sanction of EC, the proposal of post creation will be send to MHRD for the necessary approval.
  - 2) To create post of district co-ordinator (MITRA Project) on contract basis to coordinate at district level.
  - 3) To nominate one subject expert at block level who completed 10 days Vipashayana training course as block co-ordinator for MITRA Project.

### Item No.665 : To accord sanction for preparation of impanel list of uniform cloth suppliers for the scheme school uniforms.

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Under Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan, the school uniform scheme is eligible for all girls, SC boys, ST boys, and BPL boys studying in 1<sup>st</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> Government and Local Bodies school.

In the year 2010-11, this scheme is implemented vide Government Resolution dt.04/02/2012 of School Education Department. Accordingly, Maharashtra State Powerloom Corporation provided uniform cloth to School Management Committee & stitching work was done by School Management Committee. But according to letter of Ministry of Human Resource Development, dated 08/06/2012, under Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan provisions, no preference for procurement can be given to Public Sector Undertakings, Co-operative Societies, National Textile Co-operation or any other agencies of State / Central Governments.

Procurement of uniforms should be made under the limited tender method in terms of para 118 of the Manual on Financial Management and Procurement since the estimated cost at the school level will be within the financial ceiling of less than US\$50,000/- equivalent (approx. Rs. 22.50 lakh) prescribed for limited tender.

Under para 118 of Financial Management and Procurement of Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan, limited tender enquires will be issued to those firms, which are borne on the list of approved contractors / suppliers.

Andhra Pradesh Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan invited Expression of Interests for fixing suppliers of uniform cloth for empanelment by tendering process.

On the basis of Andhra Pradesh Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan, Executive Committee is requested to accord sanction for empanelment of suppliers of uniform cloth by inviting Expression of Interest.

# Item No.666 : To accord sanction for creation of posts of Data Entry Operator in State Office.

The MPSP is entrusted with the responsibility of implementation of central & State sponsored scheme of Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan since 2002-2003.

The volume of work has increased many folds since 2003-04 when the budget provision was Rs. 757 lakh and the activities were limited.

After the RTE came into existence the Budget Provisions has increased to 2626.58 lakh and as such there is burden of work has increased in every activity.

The present staff of 12 Data Entry operator cum Assistant is inadequate and therefore creation of following additional work force on contract basis is proposed.

In view of the position stated above it is proposed to create twelve posts of Data Entry Operator cum Assistant in the scale Rs. 4000-6000 (Old Scale). Prescribed qualification is Graduate in any faculty from recognized University + 40 w.p.m. in English Typing and 30 w.p.m. in Marathi Typing + Advance Diploma in Computer Science for atleast six months duration or minimum 2 years experience in handling data entry machines and computer terminals.

The additional annual financial budget of Rs.14.70 lakh shall be needed for this purpose which can the met out from the budget provisions of the management activity.

The Executive Committee is, therefore, requested to accord approval for creation of twelve posts of Data Entry Operator cum Assistant as proposed.

Item No.667 : To accord administrative approval for 3<sup>rd</sup> party consultancy services for construction of Civil works under Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan for the year 2012-13.

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Community involvement and participation is Central Objective in the construction of Civil Works under S.S.A. Most of the Civil works are to be executed in **Rural Areas** and for that purpose **technical input** is an essential ingredient for achieving **sound**, **durable and quality construction**. Civil Works are aimed to conform to best standards in the area having least possible maintenance later on. This can only be achieved if the technical input and supervision is adequate, appropriate and to the required extent.

Govt. of India instructed (vide D.O. letter No. 7-4 / 2012 EE 16, dated 3<sup>rd</sup> April, 2012) that independent assessment of technical quality of civil works through Third Party evaluation agency is mandatory and is to be carried out simultaneously during different stages of implementation for ensuring that construction has been carried out in accordance with design, drawings and specification including testing of building material, building technologies.

Since years 2004-05 except 2011-12 the State conducting a **third party** consultancy for quality supervision and certification of Civil works. Joint Review Committee has also highly appreciated & instruct to all state to undertake third party evaluation like Maharashtra & Gujrat State.

The civil works sanctioned under Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan is carried out through community participation. The allocation of fund for civil works sanction in year 2012-13 is Rs. 595.77 crores. Now the Third Party Evaluation for the civil works of 2012-13 is proposed by appointing division-wise Consultants (reputed Consultancy firm / organization / Polytechnics). The Expenditure will be based on percentage quoted by the consultancy firm / organization.

Additional support of Technical supervision preferred to be advantageous to ensure quality of construction by timely visits to work in progress. It is therefore proposed to appoint third party evaluation for civil works for the 2012-13 with additional terms & conditions so as to cover all the aspects of construction for ensuring & maintaining best quality. The consultants will be appointed Education Region wise after following the requisite procedure of floating open tender. These expenditure will incurred through the 3% contingency reserved at district level.

The Executive Committee is therefore requested to accord sanction to the above proposal.

Item No.668 : To accord sanction to start 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> Class in four KGBV's from State Budget.

There are 43 working KGBV's under SSA in the State. Out of that, at 39 KGBVs 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> classes are attached to existing KGBVs. The funding to start 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> class is sanctioned under Manav Vikas Mission's financial assistance. In 4 remaining KGBVs viz- (1) Gaganbawda (2) Dhadgaon (3) Gevrai (4) Dharur, for the reasons of sanctioned norms, Manav Vikas Mission does not provide assistance for starting 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> std.

Therefore, it is requested to provide Rs.2.30 crore per year for recurring expenditure from State Plan Budget to start 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> std. at above 4 KGBVs.

Executive Committee is therefore, requested to accord sanction to start 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> Class in four KGBV's from State Budget.

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
